It seems everywhere we go, everything we read and in our conversations we consistently discuss the economy and money issues. Unfortunately, in the church, money and finances is also a big deal. The spending plan which was approved back in November projected income and expense for 2010. All our ministry groups have done a great job keeping their spending in line with this plan. However, our revenues are not meeting projections, and as I have reported several times our cash reserves are gone. If income does not improve in the next month council will be forced to make some difficult decisions to cut expenses. Many of us have had to do this in our personal finances and no it's no fun, but is necessary.

Council will keep you informed of their actions. Any cuts will directly affect our ministry programs and most likely effect our staffing. Much of our 2010 spending plan is tied to fixed costs such as mortgage payments, utilities and insurance. St. Paul has had financial challenges in the past and has continued to grow as a congregation and I am very confident that will be the case again this time. Remembering that stewardship in all walks of our lives is everything we do after we say "I Believe." Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year. *New Consecration Sunday* is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to

our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

A Wise Decision

In 2001, at the urging of her three sons, 76-year-old Helen Goodman began to think seriously about ending her working career and relocating to a continuing care community in North Carolina. Wrapping up an entire life and relocating is no easy feat. Helen had to sell her primary residence and several income-producing properties, but she also had to review her estate documents and evaluate her assets to determine what might become of them in her retirement years and upon her death.

Ultimately, Helen wanted to supplement her fixed income so she could afford to live in a highly regarded senior community and protect her net worth. She wanted to be in a position to provide a substantial inheritance for her family members and leave a legacy to her church in gratitude for the countless blessing the Lord gave her

throughout her lifetime.

Helen heard about Charitable Gift Annuity Programs and decided to contact the ELCA and see what help they could offer during this important time. She learned that by making an irrevocable gift she could generate a regular fixed income at an attractive interest rate, reduce her estate taxes, and get a charitable tax income tax deduction. Helen was able to do all of this and ensure that the amount remaining in her account upon her death would add a much-needed donation to the Endowment Fund at her church. "The decision which I made about starting a Charitable Gift Annuity eight years ago has proved to be a wise one," she says. "During the present recession when my other investments were dropping substantially in value every week and when the income I was getting from governmentally guaranteed bank CDs was cut from 5% to less than 2%, the returns from my annuity never reduced."

Easter did not come to an end with the last Service on April 4.

The fiftieth day of Easter will celebrate the gifts of the Spirit on Pentecost Sunday, May 23, culminating the 7 Sundays of Easter. The importance of this season is made visible to us by the prominence of the paschal candle as the primary symbol of the resurrection, by white paraments and vestments, by music and song that celebrates the resurrection.

May 23, Day of Pentecost: **Red** as the color of fire is used on this day when we remember the tongues of fire descended on the crowd in Jerusalem. In contrast to the color of **Scarlet**, Pentecost's **Red** is a bright color.

May 30, The Holy Trinity: White is used this day as an expression of joy in the mystery of the Triune God.

How to Change Habits Successfully

For most people, changing long-held habits is extremely hard to do. Just think of the people you know who have tried to quit smoking, cut down on their alcohol consumption, or stop overeating. It is important to develop healthy eating and exercise habits. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), people go through 5 stages when modifying their lifestyle habits:

1. **Nonawareness**—You haven't even thought about changing your habits.
2. **Realization**—You've realized that there may be benefits to changing your habits.
3. **Ready**—You're ready for action.
4. **Action**—You take steps to change your behaviors.
5. **Maintenance**—You work toward maintaining your accomplishments.

When it comes to learning healthy habits to manage your type 2 diabetes, which stage are you in?

Your action plan for adopting healthy habits:

- **Set specific weight and exercise goals** that you can reach. Talk with your doctor to make sure the goals are realistic.
- **Break a big goal into smaller steps**—for instance, start out with a 5- to 10-minute walk 3 times a week, then walk longer and more frequently.
- **Make lifestyle changes you can live with** for the rest of your life, such as the correct portion sizes.
- **Recognize triggers** that prompt unhealthy behavior and plan how you will handle those situations in the future.
- **Reward yourself** for special milestones and progress toward healthy habits.
- **Don't go it alone**—let friends and family know about your plan to take better care of yourself. Talk with them when you need support.
- **Expect obstacles and setbacks**—then learn to deal with them and move on.

- **Go easy on yourself**—Give yourself some credit for putting the effort into making healthy changes. By doing so, you are taking positive steps to live a healthy life.

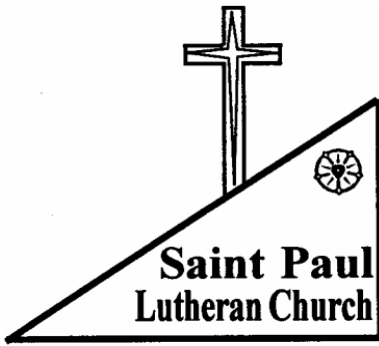
