Pastoral Ponderings:

“When they (wise men) had heard the king, they set out; and there ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.” (Matthew 2:9-10)

Star gazing is always a fun thing to do. I caught myself doing it just the other night when the wind was brisk and the night dark; I looked up and saw a sky full of twinkling and shinning stars that lit the night up like large flashlights. Stars have always amazed me, especially the thought of how for centuries they were used for navigation—getting people to where they were journeying.

As this New Year begins, we begin it in the season of Epiphany; however it is often given little notice, because it comes on the heels of post-Christmas blues and weariness. Many use the word epiphany to describe something that has happened to them with thought. “I had an epiphany!” Epiphany is much more than just that general definition. The Epiphany within the Christological context is the showing or manifestation of the revelation of God in human form in the person of Jesus Christ.

So be clear. Epiphany is a showing of the manifestation of the glory of God in Christ Jesus to the nations.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us, “The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.” (9:2)

We look to the bright shinning star—the one true Epiphany—Jesus the Christ. In looking at this bright star, we are given light to shine through whatever darkness life may bring. In this New Year, we gaze upon the bright light of Jesus and ask how this Epiphany, be made more and more visible in others lives and how can we be that bright light to the whole world.

I pray in this New Year, we continue following the brightest star that ever shone. Let this light guide us in our decisions together, as a congregation, being about the work of mission and ministry within our community and in our church. Let this light guide us in our stewardship of time, talent, and tithe; so that we shine brightly in all we do. Let this light provide hope for the hopeless, voice to the voiceless, forgiveness to the un-forgiven, and justice for the oppressed.

Oh wise men! Oh wise women! Continue following the star! Look up! Look out! Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

May this New Year give you moments of great joy, someone to hold your hand in times of sadness, love to give to all people, and love to be given to you; when you least expect it. Thank you for being bright and shinning lights in my life.

Welcome Home!

Have you searched for a place to call home? Have you looked for a community to share your gifts and grow in faith? Have you yearned for a large extended family that will support you, uplift you, walk with you, and help you grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ? Then we welcome you home to St. Paul Lutheran Church. We welcome you to come home and worship with us, dine with us, fellowship with us, grow in Christian love toward one another with us.

Have you considered becoming part of this family of faith? First off, what does it mean to be a "member" of a church? Many of us are members of Country Clubs, PTA's, Rotary, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Homeowners Association, etc. But what does it mean to be a church member? All baptized Christians are, of course, members of the Body of Christ, of the one holy, catholic, and apostolic church—whether they "do" anything about it or not. The "doing," can be signing on to a local congregation, thus becoming a member of it. In the Lutheran Church, one can become a member of the church through their baptism at that particular church, by letter of transfer from another Lutheran congregation, or by Affirmation of faith from another denomination.

But being a church member does not bring with it the same lifestyle and responsibilities that may come from being a member of Boy Scouts, PTA, Rotary, Girl Scouts, YMCA, Country Club, or others. The church does not exist so that it may be one more social sorority or fraternity for people. Instead, being a church member implies a relationship that does not hinge on what you wear, how much money you have, your race or sex. Instead, it brings the promise of eternal relations with God in Christ. This relationship is nurtured by and with the fellowship of believers, the communion of saints, the word proclaimed, the sacraments administered, and prayers said.

January 2011

What a year it has been for Cross of Grace Lutheran Church. The new community of faith began on January 3, 2010. The year has flown by quickly. Starting with about fifteen core members, we now have over forty worshippers with weekly attendance averaging twenty-five, or more. We have been blessed with people who have a wide range of interests, who come from different cultures, who experience different economic realities, and who have been life-long worshippers or those who have just begun to worship regularly. Furthermore, not many are 'life-long' Lutherans. They are seeking a relationship with Christ and find the Lutheran expression to be very helpful.

Our Thanksgiving Day worship service was a blessing. No other community of faith in Jonesborough provided a service the week of Thanksgiving. To generate interest, we distributed yard signs and posters. Thirty-four people came to give thanks to God on this secular holiday. This was the most worshippers we have had on a given day since our first worship service. Many were from the community and the others were regular worshippers. A few were from other Lutheran communities of faith. Hopefully, this will become an annual event and provide another opportunity for us to serve the community.

We are having Advent services in our home. There is no space available at the Jonesborough Area Senior Center during the week. We have two services, one at 2:00 PM and one at 7:00 PM. The combined attendance approximates eighteen people.

Our Christmas Eve Service will be at the Senior Center at 5:00 PM. We are again promoting the service with signs and posters. The strategy is different. While we were the sole provider of a Thanksgiving service, our thought this time is that many people will attend a Christmas Eve service, even if they are not part of a faith community.

Finally, please join us on January 23, 2011 for our regular Sunday worship at 9:30 AM. We will be celebrating our first anniversary. Bishop Julian Gordy will preside at the worship service. It will be a festive and joyful occasion.

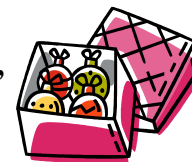

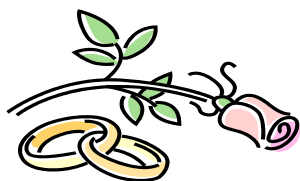
